### Digging Deeper This Week

- Monday:** Read Matthew 5:1-11 about the Beatitudes. Make a list of all the ways to receive God’s blessings and contentment and how you can also bless Him. What are one or two things you can do this week to start living that way?
- Tuesday:** Read Philippians 2:1-11. Spend some time thinking more about Jesus’ humility and what that might look like in your life in the coming days and weeks.
- Wednesday:** Read 1 Peter 4. List how going through suffering benefits both an individual and their church.
- Thursday:** Read the short book of Ruth. What are some of the admirable attitudes that Ruth modeled in her relationship with Naomi?
- Friday:** Read Psalm 51:6-12. Then ask God to reveal to you some inappropriate or out-of-line attitudes you need to change. Ask Him to show you where to start and to assist you with humility.
